Following her PhD thesis on women in nineteenth Wallachia, Nicoleta century Roman started exploring two research fields important for the Romanian and South-Eastern Europe childhood history and welfare systems. She had two

postdoctoral grants (national and international), she was a member in national and European projects and she also organised scientific events relevant for her research area.
