Daniel FILIP-AFLOAREI is Researcher at the Institute for the Investigation of the Crimes of Communism and the Memory of the Romanian Exile [IICCMER] and graduate of the Doctoral School of the Faculty of History in Iasi, “Alexandru Ioan Cuza” University, with a thesis about *Romania and the crisis of the communist regime in Poland - 1980-1989*. He was an IICCMER fellow (October 2020 - March 2021) and received two Erasmus scholarships in Poland, at “Adam Mickiewicz” University in Poznań (2016-2017) and Cardinal “Stefan Wyszyński” University in Warsaw (2018-2019).

Areas of interest: the history of international relations and diplomacy, the history of the Cold War and the history of Romanian-Polish relations during the communist period.
