



Catalin ȚĂRANU is a literary-historical scholar working on the vernacular poems and cultures of early medieval Northwestern Europe. Catalin has earned his Ph.D. from the University of Leeds and has been an Associate Professor at the University of Bonn. He has published books and articles on the emotions of medieval people, rhizomes of narrative and genre ecosystems, and theories of truth and history: most recently, his first monograph, *The Bard and the Rag-picker: Vernacular Verse Histories in Early Medieval England and Francia* (London: Routledge, 2021), and with Michael Kelly, *Vera Lex Historiae?: Constructions of Truth in Medieval Historical Narrative* (New York: Punctum Books, 2022).
