



Andreea EȘANU is a researcher in analytic philosophy and the philosophy of science, having earned her PhD in philosophy from the University of Bucharest in 2010. From 2010 to 2013 she was a postdoctoral research fellow at the University of Bucharest, Faculty of Philosophy with a research project in the philosophy of evolutionary biology. Between 2015 and 2016 she was a *Ștefan Odobleja* fellow at New Europe College, with a research project in early analytic philosophy –

particularly, Ludwig Wittgenstein's *Tractatus logico-philosophicus*. Since 2017 she has been involved in two UEFISCDI research grants in the philosophy of science, contributing as a member of the research teams.

Her publications include several articles and book chapters in the philosophy of science, such as: “Auguste Comte and J. S. Mill on physical causes. The case of Joseph Fourier's analytical theory of heat” (see [here](#)), “Franz Brentano's Multifaceted View of Induction in Empirical and Genetic Psychology” (see [here](#)), “A backward question about multilevel selection: can species selection help disentangle the notion of group selection?” (see [here](#)). Since 2021 she has been teaching various topics in philosophy as non-tenure assistant professor at University of Bucharest, Faculty of Philosophy. In 2023 she became Publications and Digitalization Coordinator at NEC.
