

Valeska BOPP-FILIMONOV

Valeska BOPP-FILIMONOV is an assistant professor (“Juniorprofessorin”) at the Institute of Romance Studies at the Friedrich Schiller University Jena in Germany. She completed her doctorate at the University of Leipzig in 2012 with a thesis on the communist era in Romania, specifically on interweaving public and family memory discourses since 1989. Since being back in academia in 2017, she has worked on various topics like multiculturalism in Southeastern Europe, the history of the “rare subject” Romanian Studies in German-speaking countries and Romanian literature with a particular focus on child protagonists in canonical literature and children’s literature in past and present. In 2022, she was awarded a Feodor Lynen Research Fellowship from the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation for a 6-month stay at the Research Institute of the University of Bucharest (Institutul de Cercetare al Universității din București, ICUB) and worked on “Fictional violence between child and animal. Key scenes in Romanian Literature“. Her latest publication is *Saddening Encounters.
