



Camil Pârvu is Associate Professor at the Faculty of Political Science, University of Bucharest and a former NEC fellow. His research develops along two principal axes: the first concerns contemporary populism examined primarily as a challenge to established scholarship on political representation. The second draws on methodological and conceptual resources from both political theory and empirical political science and seeks to address the epistemic implications of the erosion of ‘the center’, through the rise of alternative expertise within insurgent movements and the broader displacement, fragmentation and polarization of the common discursive frameworks and their institutional underpinning. He was involved in several COST actions (CA17135 - *Constitution-making and deliberative democracy* and CA22121 - *Rising nationalisms, shifting geopolitics and the future of European higher education/research openness*) and is current Lead Researcher in the project *Scaling the Transnational. Entangled Political Imaginaries and Practices in East and West Europe [STEPPE]*, funded by the German Federal Ministry of Education and Research and coordinated by The Institute of Political Science at Leipzig University, New Europe College Bucharest, The CEU Democracy Institute in Budapest, and the The Centre Marc Bloch, Berlin. Previously, he was a Member of the research team, *Critical Foundations of Cosmopolitanism*, 2012-2014, PN-IIRU-TE-2011-3-0218, funded by the Romanian Research Agency.
